The lone survivor was identified as a certain Joana Leonarda de Vera, 17, a resident of Dagupan City and a student of UPCB is presently confined at the Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center (BGHMC) recuperating from fractures in the different parts of her body as a result of the heavy impact of rocks that buried the vehicle they were riding on.

However, one of the bodies of the victims recovered from the accident site still remain unidentified. He was wearing a pair of nylon short pant, had a short hair ad a mustache ad was estimated to be about 5 feet ad four inches in height. His body still lies at the Baguio Funeral Homes awaiting identification.
